## **Association Marketing & Advertising News:**

- 1. Our Association has ADs in the current editions of the Carrier Pigeon publication and the Uptight Suburbanite publication. In fact, member John Altimari has generously offered to pay for us to have the Ads in those publications. Thank you very much, John! Given the "win win" situation for all involved, we have extended a free annual membership to John Altimari. He said "Not necessary."
- 2. Our Association also will continue to have an Ad in the Fall/Winter and Spring/Summer editions of the Upper Southampton Township and Park & Rec Newsletter which comes out twice a year.
- 3. The SB&PA again will be a sponsor for the Centennial Education Foundation (CEF) Bruce Beaton Memorial Golf Outing in June, 2025 at Spring Mill Country Club.
- 4. Our Association will soon try to have Field Banners put up on the local sports fields this Spring to advertise and also help support the children's sports programs. The same Banners were used for our Parade Float in the 2022 Southampton Days Parade and may be used in future parades including our nation's 250<sup>th</sup> celebration which will be here soon enough.

- 5. Our Association had an Ad in the Southampton Days Fair Book in 2024 and we plan to do so again this year.
- 6. Our Association will be a sponsor again for the Southampton Police golf outing which will take place in August, 2025 at Spring Mill Country Club.
- 7. We ordered, paid for and installed a new garden plaque for the Veteran's Memorial Plaza which is located at the corner of Street Road and Second Street Pike. The new plaque commemorates how our business association members have helped take care of the corner for decades.
- 8. We are thinking about a similar type plaque, a kiosk or signs or even a bench to be installed and associated with the new Hiking and Biking trail, part of the Pennypack Trail that now goes thru Southampton. More info to follow.
- 9. We plan to be the sponsor again this year for the BINGO at the Southampton Days Carnival. We donate \$50.00 each night for the last Bingo Game of the night. We ask that in return they promote our association during the evening. Our members also come out and network while playing Bingo and having a lemonade or something to eat.
- 10. CHRISTMAS LIGHTS UPDATE: As some know, our association did all the efforts to store, refit, and hang the Christmas Lights a/k/a The Holiday Lights in Southampton for approximately 35 years. The work necessary overall was enormous. Many people in town did not even know we did the lights. Eventually, we reached the point in recent years where we simply could not physically do the project anymore because we did not have the manpower. Meetings took place over many months where a new issue/obstacle arose which was PECO advising of a new charge of \$150.00 per pole to hang the light fixtures (approx. 70 fixtures) each year. The future of the project was dark and uncertain. Then the skies started to brighten. PECO advised they would waive the proposed pole fees and the Southampton Days Committee stepped forward and announced that they were willing to try and take over the project. At the December 2023 SB&PA BOD's meeting it was unanimously approved to sign over ownership of all the lights equipment to the Southampton Days Committee. Our Board also voted unanimously to do our best within reasonable limits to continue with financial support of the project each year. That way, we can continue to play a role in the holiday lights. The Southampton Spirit Newspaper printed a nice article about the transition and community team effort in their December 2023 issue. This year we donated the sum of \$500.00 to help with the holiday lights project.
- 11. We have an Ad about our association the annual calendar distributed by the Southampton Lions Group.
- 12. At our Christmas Lunch event we raffled off and paid for a spotlight Ad for one of our members in the 2025 Library Newsletter mailings. The winning business this year was RT&T, Inc.

13. The BOARD OF DIRECTORS is considering running a Food Expo & Business Expo Community Event in the Fall to take place in an area shopping center. We may also do a Cornhole Contest fundraiser to raise money and raise awareness for the Danenberger Foundation. More details to follow.

1. There is a new road sign for local Civic groups now finished on Street Road as you enter Southampton coming from Feasterville. Our Association is included on the sign.
